We are using Letio Divina as a contemplative way of reflecting on the Gospel reading, Lettio Divina dates back to the early centuries of the Christian Church and was established as a monastic practice by Benedict in the 6th century, it is a way of praying the Scriptures that leads us deeper into God's word. We show down. We read a short passage more than once. We deep the overslowly and carefully. We savor it. Scripture begins to speak to us in a new way. It speaks to us personally, and aids that union we have with God through Christ.
