

staff stretched thin/disconnected



We build community through hospitality

lights on, warm welcome, safe space, clean space, know how to engage, people to help, information, signage, invitation, acknowledgement, how to do church here (FF, Adult Ed, youth ministry, sacraments etc), never a disparaging word, food, refreshments, needs anticipated, joyful people up front.

Helping people feel like they belong and are part of the community right away. They are the insiders.






Empathy

what are you passionate about? what is a great need right now?




Come up with a fabulous long list of ideas from crazy to doable, everything goes!


